Chappy Remembers Everything!

This came to us this week from Garry Chapman via the BCC webpage.

Greetings all,

The recent sad news of the passing of Sir Donald Bradman plunged cricket followers worldwide into mourning. Some of our senior citizens recalled fondly the times they went with their fathers to the MCG to see the great man in action, while others remembered winter nights by the crystal radio set listening to Alan McGilvray's classic descriptions of The Don's Ashes triumphs.

The Don was not the only cricket legend whose loss we mourned last week. Many of us will retain fond memories of HDCA umpire Vin Rowan, who passed away just days before Bradman.

Vinny umpired many games on the old Banyule High School ground and he always took steps to make sure we knew he was in control. Whenever a game threatened to run smoothly and controversy-free, Vin would step in with an obscure ruling or two to get us all steamed up.

Once for example, Greg Russell Sr skied a ball which was caught by a fieldsmen just behind square leg. As Greg had proved difficult to dislodge, the fielder was elated and kept jogging the remaining 30 or 40 metres to the fence and out through the gate in celebration, tossing the ball high as he went. Poor Greg was over half way to the boundary when Vinny shocked us all by turning to the scorers and signalling 'six'. Amidst howls of protest, he insisted that once the fielder had left the field of play, the dismissal ceased to be and that as the ball had still not hit the ground, it had earned six runs. We weren't going to argue with that ruling, but the opposition carried on for ages. Vinny just smugly ordered them to get on with the game.

My own personal favorite memory of Vin was that he was standing behind the stumps when I scored 17 from a single ball at Windsor Reserve and earned a place in the Guinness Book of Records. Chris Veal and I counted every run aloud as

we trudged back and forth along the pitch, fearful that Vinny would not have been counting. We underestimated him, of course. When the ball was finally retrieved and returned the bowler, Vin turned to the scorers and called out in his distinctive northern England accent' "Scorers ... That be seventeen!" Then he turned to me and confided," 'aven't got signal for seventeen!" He then proceeded to give the Macleod boys a dressing down for failing to call 'Lost ball!". You just couldn't keep him out of the game, even though his hearing failed him more times than I'd care to remember, and his judgement of LB's was often questionable. He was a good bloke and we'll miss him. He gave many years of good service to our great game. Rest in peace, Vin Rowan.
