Welcome Back!

The smell of freshly cut grass, the smell of blossoming flowers, the sound of people sneezing, AFL grand final day, we must be on the verge of the cricket season! Yes, it's that time of the year again when we open our cricket bags and realise we still have our dirty whites from our last game sitting in there. Roll the arm over in the nets and get pins and needle up our arms, try and play a cover drive and miss the ball by a foot. Cricket season!

I have great pleasure in welcoming everyone back for the start of the 2001-02 season, and what a season it looks like being. We have the challenges of A & C Grade striving for back to back premierships, and A Reserve & D Grade trying to dispose of last years disappointment and get that one step further and take home the premiership.

Once again the club has been busy during the off season around the traps. Ando has been elected as president replacing Jed, Philo is once again vice president and Greg Barnes has replaced Ando as vice president. Veally has replaced Gibbo as secretary and Marty Phillips is once again treasurer. Brent O'Connor has been appointed as coach for the 2001-02 season.

The social committee has several functions planned for this season, and you can find the calender for this further in the Howzat. After last years modest attendances in several functions, we are giving everybody ample notice and we expect that everyone make a big effort to attend as many functions as possible.

And now for the usual start of season reminders! Home sides are to bring afternoon tea, don't leave it up to another player to bring it. We have a good reputation for afternoon teas let's continue the tradition. Players are only to wear Banyule caps or white floppy hats. If you do not have either of these please see Ando.

The competition has introduced several new rules this season, some good, some not so good. Ocka & Ando will go through these in more detail tonight but these are what I can remember off the top of my head. If a player is reported the captain of the team is also reported. So if you muck up you will not only get suspended or the club fined it will happen to the captain also, so make sure you pull your heads in! The boundary of each ground has been defined as the bottom corner of the fence, line, witches hat whatever may be the case. So on our grounds if the ball hits the fence on the full it's 6. The last point is the HDCA have set up a new points system, which you will find a little confusing and to the detriment of the game! The percentage has been abolished. The ladder is decided on points, if teams are level on points it goes to wickets lost. So if you win the first game and lose 8 wickets, and somebody else wins and only loses 6 wickets, they will be higher on the ladder. Then if wickets lost is also the same it goes on a form of percentage which is (runs for minus runs against) divided by (wickets taken minus wickets lost).

We will have a cleaning roster this season. We have been spoilt in the past with your Ando's, Jedda's, Ronnie Butlers, John Veals and the like trudging down each Sunday morning to clean up the club. Each player will be rostered on probably twice throughout the season. The group will have 4 people in it and should only take 45 minutes on a Sunday morning to get it done. Each group will have a "captain", he will have keys, an instruction lis, be responsible for each group attending, arranging a time to meet etc. If you can't make it on the day you are rostered you are to see Philo and a swap will be arranged. 45 minutes of your time on a couple of Sundays is not too much to ask, if everyone participates it will be quick and easy.
