Being at the business end of the season we needed to perform to place ourselves in a strong position against Heidelberg who have been performing well in the last few games. Once again Aditya won the toss and elected to bat, he opened with Nathan but unfortunately we lost Nathan early with the score on 13. This brought Aidan to the crease and he and Aditya settled things until Aditya was out for 29 and the score on 58. From here on we fell away with no player reaching double figures except for Aidan who returned to the crease after retiring on 50 and finished with 64 valuable runs. We failed to bat our overs and were all out for 132, this left 5 overs to bowl and hopefully pick up a wicket or two. In the first over Rayan bowled a ball that swung and cut to beat the opening bat and take out his stumps, the perfect start. Next over Marcus was not going to be out-done and with his first ball removed the new batsmen to have Heidelberg 2/2 with a bit of luck he almost collected another wicket. Having Heidelberg 2/7 overnight was getting us back into the game but we needed to continue with the pressure on day 2.

With our captain unavailable due to school commitments Rayan had the job to control the field and make the necessary bowling changes it was a game that would test his mental pressure and he come through with flying colours.

With conditions not being perfect for cricket the boys applied themselves with the slippery ball and had the knack to pick up a wicket when required. Andrew and Michael were brought on when the game was in the balance and got the breakthroughs required that once again got us back in the game. Heidelberg had one player retired on fifty who we felt could take the game from us if we let things begin to slip but the boys stuck to the job with a brilliant run out by Nathan after making a save for 4 turned things our way. With the retired batsman back in and the pressure building on players and spectators Michael "Ricky Ponting " Ryan made another fine save and returned the ball to Rayan who ran out the stranded batsman to give us victory and a Grand Final Berth against Rosanna.

What a great win.

We lost the toss. Heidelberg was one of two teams to beat us throughout the year. They began well and 30 without loss after 8 overs. Garrick Melton got the break through and we made steady in roads into their batting, with Garrick snaring 3 wickets and Rhys Bevan getting 2. Mick Abrahams was his usual frugal self in bowling two more opposition batsmen and Sam Place picked up the vital wicket, due to a Nikhail catch, of young Cashen who had already made 37 and was well on his way to retirement. This would have meant he could have returned later to plunder more runs. We finally got them all out in the 43rd over. We had to bat 4 overs until 11:45am. In that time we managed to lose 3 wickets and make 2 runs!!

We were still confident that we would win. We had plenty of depth. Next day we lost Micky Delaney in the 4th over to be 4 for 5. This brought our Skipper Scott Shelton, who had been ill all week, to the crease. He was partnered with Vice Captain Sam Place who was nothing at the time. With sensible batting and strong self-belief they went about rebuilding our innings. They put on 67 runs before Sam was out for a determined 20 with the score 5 for 72. Scott was joined by Mick Abrahams who is a whippet between wickets and together they added another 24 runs before Scott had to retire for a fantastic 52 runs. Rhys Bevan was now at the wicket and had made 50 against the same oppostion a few weeks earlier. He smashed a quick 14 runs and now we were 6 for 120. 19 runs behind and 8 overs left. Garrick Melton came out and belted 10 runs and we were now 7 for 138. We still need another 2 runs for victory. A no-ball saw us tie and go to the Grand Final and the Cam McDonald hit a two for us to really win with 3 overs remaining. This week we play the 'sannas at Banyule Flats for the U/14 pennant.
