# The Beck's Bedding Quote of the Week.



The 1<sup>st</sup> X1 played Rosanna first game up as with all grades. Ocka (Brent O'Connor), as he has threatened over the years, wanted to bowl first. His previous vice captain has managed to talk him out of this in the past but with Peter Costello (Jeff Wilson) now in support it was all gungho. It proved a good move ON THIS OCCASION (Sorry Ocka, the writer unabashedly inserting a personal opinion: team fine probably pending).

With a few of the bowlers dusting off winter cobwebs we applied ourselves in a typical Banyule performance. Decent bowling spread throughout the ranks ensured we restricted the Sanna's to the subdued total of 160. Fielding on a ground unimaginably bumpier than ours we put body in front of ball (D Lo even used his head) in an admirable fielding performance.

D Lo the pick with 3 wickets including a wicket with his first ball of the year, Veally (Tim Veal), Philo (Philip Barnes) & Ocka each of 2 and Chicken Man (Andy Stuart) capturing his first wicket for the Yules. A terrific effort first up behind the stumps by The Colonel (Aiden Young).

After a somewhat hectic pre-game, we won the toss and batted. Feroze and Marty got us off too a good start. Feroze was surprising even himself with his timing before be bowled leaving one that cut back in and stayed low. Chooka (Russell Felthouse) (10) came in and timed the ball beautifully before being caught lifting one on the slow pitch. Waheed (19) played aggressively with three 4's over cover and mid-off before he was also caught out by the slow pitch and was caught & bowled. Scooby (Matthew O'Ryan) came in a batted with unprecedented control to see us through to break 3 down for 120+.

After break the tiring Scooby decided he was going to create short balls and started pulling anything that wasn't a half volley. At about 180 Marty was out for 97 and young Hollywood (Lucas Willoughby) joined Scoob. Scoob continued to bat aggressively before skying a full toss to cover to be out for 47. Usha (Michael Harte) (3) was out soon after and when PD (Paul Davis), who was looking in complete control, got caught on the mid-wicket boundary and then Billy succumbed for a duck it looked like we might have to bowl 10 overs ourselves. However, first gamer Ian Healy (A.K.A Graham Bennett) and our VC Barnesy provided great support for Hollywood (37 not out) to see us bat through the 80 overs with an extremely competitive score of 266.

The bowling started brilliantly with Billy getting the first wicket bowled and then taking a brilliant catch at third slip off Barnesy's tight bowling. PD picked up the third & fourth – one caught by Chooka at point (making the difficult look easy) and an Ian Healy ripper one-handed catch diving to his right. Billy came back to take no.5 bowled and then some brilliant fielding by Usha gave us our first run out for the year. Special note should be made of Chooka's 72 balls which produced about 30 play and misses. Rosanna 6 for 90 odd at break.

Rosanna fought hard after break however Chooka kept his calm to provide us wicket no.7 and run out no.2 and then Billy at slip again combined with Barnesy for no.8.
