On a fairly warm first Saturday we ventured down Oriel Rd to the ubiquitous Seddon Reserve. On first impressions just an average looking oval but equipped with a magnificent bar that would not be out of place in many a hotel or RSL. After losing the toss we were asked to bat first apparently due to some shenanigan or other with the opposition player availability. We couldn't have cared less and went about our task with breathtaking audacity. Chooka (R. Felthouse) set to the opening bowlers with gusto amassing 61 in the blink of an eye. Peter Costello (J. Wilson), Colonel (A. Young) and Occa (B. O'Connor) all got starts and kept the score ticking along. Occa's innings was uncustomary for its lack of pace as he willingly played the support role to big hitting at the other end. In a record 8th wicket partnership for A grade of 96 they both pummelled the bowling each reaching 50 with Fez smashing 63 and Moshie an equally exhilarating 54no. With the game virtually a non-event by day 2 we all bowled well in wet and difficult conditions restricting West Ivanhoe to 172 off 60 overs. Philo (P. Barnes), Occa, D Lo (D. Barnes), Fez and Peter Costello all nabbed a wicket each whilst Chicken Man picked up 2. His Kevin Brady Medal chances again done no damage. Highlights of day 2 were the run outs effected by Marty Veal and Peter Costello and one of West Ivanhoe's batsman announcing at the end of one over "See you later fella's, I've got to go to work, have a Merry Christmas" and promptly walking off the ground. He was their best bat too being on 53 at the time. We also awarded Peter Costello a moral hatrick as he had collected wickets with his last 2 balls of the previous game and then clean bowled a batsman with his first ball of this game. We think he may be from the sub continent in a past life as he does some pretty interesting things with the old ball.

At Christmas we sit well clear in second place with a huge percentage. We still want top place though and need an outright victory and to also beat Greensborough to achieve this.

This was a crucial game leading up to Christmas with Banyule 3rd playing Greensborough 1st, who had beaten Edinburgh outright, and we has lost to Edinburgh outright.

After losing yet another toss Greensborough sent us in on what was a reasonable ground, although the grass was quite long around the fence, and with the long range forecast looking like it was going to be a stinker on the 2nd week. We got off to a bad start losing Matty Holmes (2) early and were 1/3 after 3 overs, Marcus joined Brad, and together they started putting on quick runs and taking the score to 54 off 18 overs, they didn't look like getting out until Marcus ran himself out on 21. We then lost 2 quick wickets with Brad being caught behind for 34 (5 4's) and Scooby caught for 1 leaving us 4/65 off 22 overs, and at tea we were 4/123 off 40 overs with J.D. and Crawfo together. Soon after tea we suffered another collapse losing J.D. (60 7 fours), Crawfo (10), Hollywood (Lucas) (3), and Brownie (15) leaving us 8/163 off 56 overs and not looking too good, however we still had P.D. Andrew Young, and Big Dave to bat. P.D. and Andrew putting on 50 before Paul (20) was out caught leaving us 9/213 off 72 overs, Big Dave joined Andrew and took the score to 235 off 75 overs with some big hitting by Andrew (42 4 4's and 1 6) and Dave 6 no.

Greensborough had 4 overs to face from P.D. and Andrew and at the end of the day were 0/1 with both bowlers bowling 2 maidens each and the run being a leg bye.

The 2nd Saturday was not the conditions Greensborough had been hoping for quite cool and with rain forecast, and the ground slow, they started off very cautiously and after 13 overs for the day (17 for the match) were 1/16 with P.D. getting the 1st wicket caught behind by Brownie, we soon had them 2/22 when Andrew took his 1st wicket for the club caught by Big Dave, they then suffered a mini collapse with P.D. getting the next 2 wickets both bowled and we had them 4/38 off 25 overs. Marcus came into the attack replacing Andrew and kept the pressure on and in his 5th over took 2 wickets leaving them reeling at 7/70 and at tea off 38 overs were 7/72 requiring 163 runs with 3 wickets and 46 overs remaining. They gave us a bit of a hurry up when their no. 9 & 10 batsmen started swinging the bat, but it was to all avail with us getting them all-out for 139 off 53 overs. It was a great team performance considering the conditions before tea with rain falling sometimes quite heavily, and at one stage came off, fortunately for us the seam split on the ball and we were able to replace it with a ball that was not waterlogged, and with some excellent bowling by all bowlers P.D. 15 overs 9 maidens, Andrew 20 overs 8 maidens, Marcus 7 overs, Big Dave 5 overs 1/15, Crawfo, 5.1 overs 1/25 and Scooby 1 over 1/8 and being backed up with some great fielding particularly by Lucas and 7 catches taken and maybe 2 missed.

This win has taken us to 2nd behind Edinburgh, with 4 games remaining. Although we play only 1 side in the four after the break we must keep the pressure on in each match and make sure we are there at the end of the season as one loss could see us miss the finals.
