We came into the game against Heidelberg with the knowledge that we were going to be playing them again in the Semi-Final, and with that knowledge we sent Philo (Philip Barnes) down to the beach to rest up for the Semi. This absence gave the chance to young Marcus Kernaghan to play his first game of A Grade so congratulations to Marcus. We bowled on the first day on the ever-worsening Beverley Road pitch after Ocka (Brent O'Connor) won the toss and sent Heidelberg in. After Ocka's recent problems with being truthful and earning himself the title of Captain Pinocchio we did actually have to ask the opposition Captain who won the toss to find out why we were bowling.

Ocka opened up with Chickenman (Andy Stuart) and got the first of his five wickets early. The intensity of the team in the first session didn't quite seem up to our usual lofty standards and at break Heidelberg were 2/110. With Philo not playing we actually got through 43 overs to break, usually due to his 50 step run up from the goal square we are behind at the break, but with Philo missing and Ando (Greg Anderson) getting a good spell under his belt before the interval we were well place to get off the ground on time for a change.

After break we set about containing Heidelberg as they were in a good position to launch. Tight bowling from Peter Costello, 16 overs straight, (Jeff Wilson) and Dlo (Daniel Barnes) saw the Heidelberg scoring slow and a wicket to each bowler saw us edge our way back into the game at the final drinks break. After drinks Ocka came back on to collect the final 3 wickets of his Michelle "Fivefor" and Chickenman came back on to collect one. After break the bowling and fielding were spot on, especially to Fez (Chris Carroll) who at short cover did a truckload of work and late in the day was the only player in close to the bat but still kept saving runs. Heidelberg finished 9/230, a total that would be a good test but one we believed was achievable.

We began the run chase positively with Peter Costello and Chooka (Russell Felthouse) sharing a quick partnership of 34 before Chooka was rushed to hospital with third degree burns after hitting the ball straight to mid off and calling yes only to regret the call and be run out by a bit. Ace (Aiden Young) pushed the score along hitting a quickfire 19 to leave the good guys 2/69 at drinks and looking good. The next period was when the trouble began, in the space of only a few balls we suddenly went to 4/71 with Peter Costello after a good knock of 38 bowled and Chickenman departing early. Not long after Ocka joined the procession of wickets to see the team 5/100 at the tea break with Ando and Home Brand (Martin Veal) at the crease. After the break these two set about turning the strike over and raising the run rate and had the game within reach for the team until Marty fell for a well compiled 50 runs. With overs running out as well as wickets Ando soon followed after batting well for 49 runs. Unfortunately it wasn't to be, Fez gave us a glimmer of hope towards the end with 15 but we were dismissed for 207, 23 short of our target. Not the way we wanted to finish as we had hoped to finish undefeated, but with no next week to the losers of the Semi-Final it was not a bad time to drop one to re-focus ourselves for next week.

Last game of the season and we needed to beat Greensborough to remain 1st on the ladder as the odds were that Edinburgh would defeat Bellfield outright (which happened) and they would end on top if we lost. Off to Loyola College we went to find the ground in one of the worst conditions we have ever seen, tufts of grass with a bare patch in front of it then another bare patch behind there were times when you would be right behind the ball and it would go at right angles, even the run ups for the bowlers at one end were extremely bad with a hole or divot right in the middle, which caused Paul Davis to change ends he was having that much trouble. Brad lost the toss again winning only 3 tosses for the season with Ian Crawford winning the other. Greensborough decided to bat and we had them in trouble early which has been the case for most of the season. Not that we got early wickets, with Paul Davis, and Andrew Young bowling tightly and the fielding tight given the condition of the ground, after 15 overs they were 0/24, then P.D. got the breakthrough that we wanted by having their captain caught behind by Geoff Place and then their 2nd wicket same result, and after 22 overs we had them 2/35 then 3/38, 4/55, 5/55 with 2 wickets to Greg Barnes and being on a hat trick, Rayan Moore came on and in his 4th over got the wicket that he deserved and at tea 6/74 off 38 overs. The 2nd over after tea Rayan got his 2nd wicket and they were in heaps of trouble being 7/83 off 40 overs. Unfortunately for us they had 2 guys who swung like a barn door in the wind and put on 78 runs for the 8th wicket until Andrew Young cleaned one of them up bowling him for 43, Ian Crawford got the next wicket extremely ell caught by Mathew O'Ryan who

always seems to take a reflex catch most matches, and they were 9/178 off 56 overs, then Keogh 102no who had taken the long handle to Greg Barnes and Ian Crawford decided he would bat out the 80 overs and took singles and an occasional 2 off Andrew Young, Matty O'Ryan and then Matty Holmes only to have his batting partner run out by David Veal and Paul Davis. We ended up having them all out off 70 overs leaving us 10 overs to bat. The fielding was reasonably good considering the condition of the ground as I mentioned before, also the fact that we didn't have either Rennah or Adrian Brown to keep wickets and that Geoff Place who hadn't kept for at least 8 years did a fantastic job with 2 catches and only lettings through 10 byes, when Greensborough keeper who keeps regularly dropped a couple of catches and let through 11 byes. Great job Geoff, and that's just not from me, it's from the whole team.

Dave Wilson kept up his catching skills of the match before this time taking 2. The wickets were evenly spread with P.D. 15 overs 6 maidens 2/27, Andrew Young 22 overs 7 maidens, 2/40, Rayan Moore 8 overs 1 maiden 2/21 Greg Barnes 10 overs 1 maiden 2/54 and Crawf 8 overs 1 maiden 1/47, with Scooby 4 overs 0/19, Matty Holmes 2 overs 0/6, and Dave Wilson 1 over 0/2. Brad and Dave opened the batting with the intention of getting as many runs as possible without losing and wickets which they did at the end of the day we were 0/40off 10 overs. Day 2 and with a warm day predicted things looked as if we would have the better of the batting conditions however that was not to be the case with the ground very slow, shots that were 4 last week we were only getting 2's. Brad and Dave added another 12 runs before Dave was dismissed for 15, then David Veal went 1st ball to a good catch but should never had played the shot 1st ball, leaving us 2/52 off 17 overs, Scooby (Matty O'Ryan) and was looking good until he fell to a catch that was juggled 3 times for 7 3/74. Crawf (Ian Crawford) came in and with some excellent batting and running between wickets except for 1 occasion were Brad was nearly run out the decision of not out being given by Greg Barnes infuriated Greensborough so much they told the Umpire they wanted him replaced. Brad and Crawf took the score to 169 until Brad was out caught for 74 including 11 4's after 54 overs batting 31 overs together. Rayan Moore joined Crawf after not having a hit in a match since November was out for 4 5/184, P.D. 11 was out caught leaving us 6/201 off 63 overs with 27 overs to come for the day, Jed then joined Crawf and as usual batted sensibly giving Craw the strike if he possibly could, together they took the score to 224 before Crawf who was suffering cramps in his hands and forearms was out caught for a well made 75 including 10 4's leaving us with 11 runs to win, 3 wickets and 17 overs left. Matty Holmes joined Jed and together they took us past Greensborough's score with Jed being out caught behind 13 and Matty not out 8 and still 10 overs left. I know I have mentioned the efforts of Geoff Place earlier however I would like to congratulate him on his keeping efforts it is not an easy job at the best of times. Well done Geoff.

This win has left us on top of the ladder and play Old Ivanhoe in the semi. Let's not leave the batting to a few to get the runs we need or set ourselves, and continue on with the fielding holding all our catches and getting our body behind the ball when it's on the ground. Congratulations and good luck to 1st and 4th grades in their semi-finals. Bad luck to Marty Phillips and his 2nd grade team on missing out on the four by finishing 5th. Next season is yours for the taking guys. Also Congratulations to all the coaches of our Junior sides who I believe are all in the Finals, a job well done by all involved.
