Gannon return welcomed by BCC

With the departure of long-time captain-coach Greg Anderson from coaching responsibilities, the door was recently opened for former Banyule premiership batsman Ashleigh Gannon to return to the fold.

Gannon has stepped immediately and impressively into the position of captain/ coach, from where he will guide the club in it's quest for HDCA domination.

Gannon played a key role in the A-Grade success of the mid-90's, after trying his hand at District level. Sojourns into the dank, seaming wickets of England followed, where cricket and other facets of life were enjoyed to the full.

After an extended period of rehabilitation, Gannon has sounded a warning to rival HDCA clubs by declaring his fitness and hunger for the upcoming 99/00 season.

Season 99/00 almost upon us

The new season is rapidly approaching. Days are getting longer, skies are looking bluer, and the smell of freshly cut grass is just around the corner. All of this means one thing: footy finals. Or, if you're a Collingwood supporter, it means that the new cricket season is mercifully close.

For those of us forced to endure an horrific football season this year, respite is at hand.

Like Ricky Ponting at a nightclub, the next few weeks are sure to pass in a rushed blur of activity. Indoor training, practice sessions at Binnak Park, and Banyule outdoor training are all in full swing.

Looking back on the off-season, perhaps the greatest memory to come from this time was in fact related to cricket. Who could forget the outrageous Australian victory of cricket's World Cup in July?

By May 26th, Australia had been defeated by New Zealand in Cardiff, and Pakistan had just rolled us in Yorkshire. Shane Lee had played a match, while Tom Moody had not. Adam Dale was opening the bowling and Glenn McGrath was bowling first change. To reach the next phase of the tournament; the "super sixes" would now require two good wins and a slice of luck.

Despite this, Steve Waugh remained confident. His attitude in the face of adversity is something to consider when we next play this funny game:

"May 26. Despite our two defeats in the World Cup to date, the morale in the camp – contrary to one stray media report – remains high...I can never understand why some people just want to make our task more difficult.

"And difficult, we accept our task from here will be, given our losses to New Zealand and Pakistan. But it's not hopeless, even though we realise that even if we win our last two games it will probably come down to tiebreakers as to who goes through. Our job is to try to win, hopefully decisively, and let the calculators of run-rates and the like look after our fate.

"One thing I do know is that if we do scrape into the super six, we'll be a danger to any team we face. Sure, we were below our best against the New Zealanders – who are capable on their day of beating anyone – but we improved against the Pakistanis, who are, of course, one of the most dangerous sides in world cricket. In fact, I thought we were excellent for 85 overs against Wasim Akram's men, it was only in their final 15 overs, when they smashed us at almost 10 an over and really got excited towards the end, that our performance fell away. And even then, perhaps it was a case of how well our opponent batted in the final 15 overs, rather than how we performed.

"We knew they batted right down to No. 8, where Moin Khan was lurking. His 31, scored from just 12 electrifying balls, was the difference in the end.

"Our batting was excellent – to get 265 against the Pakistan attack was a good effort, especially as it got very dark as the night time approached and the ball began swinging more than ever. Personally, I'm hitting the ball quite okay, though I was disappointed not to turn my hand at Headingley into a matchwinning innings.

"We'll take the criticism we've copped for our two defeats, and the fact we've already been written off in some quarters, as an added spur. Hopefully we'll earn the chance to prove people wrong... I have a feeling, based on our display against Pakistan, that we are actually running into some form. "I just hope we haven't left our run too late."

Of course, the lads certainly hit their straps after this. Playing positively and with confidence, the canary yellows did not lose again for the whole tournament – and we all know now that Steve Waugh certainly was "hitting the ball quite okay."
