

#### A Grade Tight bowling wins the day

Batting first at Beverly Road, the new look Banyule A Grade side got off to a good start, faltered, and then finished with 8/107 from 37 overs in their tussle with Banksia. Lush grass made this a very competitive score, with Sir Martin Phillips surprising pundits by scoring 39 at the top of the order. His innings included a "tommy micks" that whacked into the Peter Mydlar Motors sign on the full. Surely this is worth a new car...? Captain/ coach "Red Bull" Gannon was happy to collect 35 runs, batting at #3.

In reply, the Banksia line-up never really threatened the target, eventually being dismissed for just 74. The pick of the bowlers was Doc Neilson, with 4/28 from his 10 overs.

Captain Gannon would later describe the win as "satisfying," saying that the team had "dotted the i's and crossed the t's."
